3. Read **Matthew 5:43-48**. What does Jesus tell us to do in this passage? Why is it hard to do this?

4. Why do you think Jesus wants us to serve others, even if it's the people we don't like?

5. Read **Romans 5:6-11**. What does this verse show us about God's love toward us?

**Challenge: God showed love to us even when we were sinners and his enemies. Think of one person you don't really like and serve them. Write down what you did on the back.**
